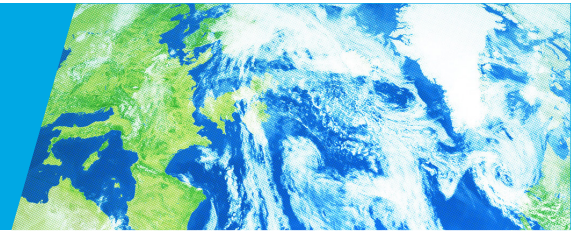


CURIOSITY AT HOME

EARTH DAY SCAVENGER HUNT



Grades K–2

Below is a list of things to find and activities to do. Some are easy and may be found where you live; others are harder, and you may have to go for a walk.

How many things can you find and do?

CAN YOU FIND THESE THINGS?

(Be sure to not disturb them!)

- a bird
- a mammal
- an insect
- a plant budding
- a flower blooming
- a pollinator (like a bee, hummingbird or butterfly)
- a recycle bin
- something made from recycled materials
- something that was designed to be used over and over instead of once
- an animal's home
- a way people are helping save resources, like solar panels, a rain barrel, or a recycle bin



DO THE FOLLOWING:

- find three different types of leaves, and make leaf rubbings in your science notebook
- draw one of the animals you found
- collect 3 pieces of trash (be sure to wash your hands afterwards)
- plant something. How long do you think it will take before you see it sprout? Make a prediction in your science notebook.
- find 4 different shades of the color green, and draw them
- turn off lights when you leave the room
- Make a decoration for Earth Day. It could be something you draw in your science notebook, or something bigger, that you can hang in your window.
